Four Pillars as also recognised as a real living wage employer in December 2022</li> <li>The completion of the community room for outreach, training and groups which can host up to 30 people at a time, leaving our 50 seated capacity hub open to the public for drop-in sessions longer.</li> <li>2022 saw the return of Grampian Pride, which was deemed a success with 8,000 attendees at the parade and 4,500 within the festival area.</li> <li>Four Pillars was nominated for charity of the year at the Proud Scotland awards.</li> </ul>
